The Embassy of Liechtenstein was the distinguished venue for a reception to welcome the Fall cohort of Civic Tech Superheroes to Washington, DC and celebrate the 10th anniversary of the #CivicTech movement. It brought together prominent figures from the tech industry, government, and diplomatic community. The event was hosted by H.E. Georg Sparber, with the invaluable leadership of 'Coach' Kathy Kemper, Founder and CEO of the Institute for Education, and Dr. R. David Edelman, President of the same institution, who graciously welcomed guests and made remarks.

One of the key highlights of the evening was the presence of Matt Lira, former CEO of RoundTable, who served as Special Assistant to the President for Innovation Policy and Initiatives at the White House Office of American Innovation from 2017 to 2021.
